This should be the weekly To-do list, the very first that appears on the calendar page, and last page

Progression status page
Show all progress just click
This should be a page that you can click on and see your progress in the course. It should be a page that you can click on and see your progress in the course.

Generally speaking, what the students want here is the functionality of google calendar, with the school schedule included. Integration with the major commercial calendar - Google, MS, Apple.
Possible placement for a "Generate study times" function. Maybe for the students for the purpose, it may also be good to have the possibility of setting up personal study times, and personal times, say times that should primarily be used, times that can be used when the optimal time for use, and times that should never be used no matter how much there is to do.

On this page there should be a way of ranking the different subjects according to how important they are for the individual student to focus on, possibly just by reordering the subject/course? Other than that, link to the course page.
Subjects should be colour coded throughout the whole homepage, with the ability to search which courses associate with which courses.

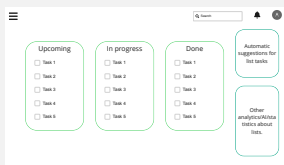
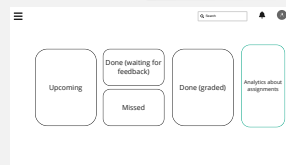
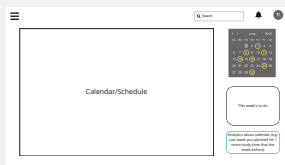
The assignment page basically collects all the assignments in all courses. From here it should be easy to go to a specific assignment, to add an assignment to a specific to-do list, to go to result/feedback for an assignment, and possibly to ask for an extension on an assignment. Also, allow filtering assignment based on type.

Lists: Being able to access lists that may be created in courses (teacher or student created), automatically generated lists) or list items, but also to be able to make their own lists. Students refer often to Trello as inspiration for what they are after. My interpretation is Kanban.

Notes: Be able to create personal notes, as well as collaborative notes. Sort notes by subject, or in other ways. Being able to write/sketch by hand, not only by keyboard.

Analytics is generally spread out and should be integrated in the whole webpage, but it is suitable to have one page that collects, sorts and allows for deeper analytics.

Main areas for analytics that have come up:
- Study hours connected to a set goal, and to results.
- Results over time.
- Study hours over time.
- Number of hand-ins
- Attendance
- To-do lists (or tasks)
- How much of the course is done? In time as well as other goals.
- How much of this weeks' work is done
- Sense-of-accomplishment or encouraging statistics
- Fun statistics



Get to the assignment page by clicking an assignment result, or calendar, or from lesson/course pages. The most important feature for the assignment page: Temporal information (when is the due date, what is the assignment subject, expected of me, and importance how important is the assignment for my development, and for my grade)
Here the student should also be able to normally the priority of an assignment, and generate study times that will appear in the calendar.
