A lot of lip service is being paid to making scientific papers free to access but when it comes to action there is a lot of hypocrisy, according to Robert-Jan Smits, the EU's outgoing director-general for research, science and innovation. He has recently been appointed the EU's special envoy on open access, tasked with helping make all publicly funded research in Europe freely available by 2020.


Making scientific publications free to read is a big change in a world dominated by subscription journals. Why is it so important that science publications become open access?

How Do We Define Open?


- No barriers to read or download digital material
- Author/creator keeps the copyright & right to attribution
- License to allow free use, reuse and sharing
- Available in an open space






Licensing

- BY The intrinsic right to be recognised as an author
- In order to share
 - non-commercially (NC)
 - Equal Terms, "share alike" (SA)
 - Wholly, without amendments, no derivatives (ND)








Other models? Grey | Bronze | Brown | Black | Diamond | Freemium etc. – perhaps only adding to the confusion.

What About Preprints?


- Low threshold for fast & open publishing
- Trustworthy platforms on the rise
- Requires knowledge about metadata & formats
- Think about where and when and for whom you publish

 - Ethical responsibility for the content






Library Support for Publishing Open

- Funding for publishing in full OA journals




Share and type of open access at SU

Total cost of open access articles (APCs) at Stockholm University 2017



Funding for full OA Journals

- Criteria
 - Corresponding author affiliated with SU
 - Full Open Access journals only →listed in DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals)
 - APC for accepted article must not have been paid already
- Always use your SU Email address

FAQ about Open Access & publishing costs

- What about old Elsevier articles, how can we access them?
 - You have access to all Elsevier journals before June 30th, 2018 via the normal channels.
 - If you want new articles, you can use the online tool "Get it Now" to order directly, or e-mail openaccess@su.se for further advice.
 - Other options for new articles from Elsevier are the tool https://unpaywall.org/ or to e-mail the author.
- What OA options do I have if I want to publish?
 - It depends on the journal or platform, of course.
 - You can search in the database http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/index.php for publishers or journals.
- What is the advantage of a publisher version vs. a pre- or post-print?
 - Publisher version could be more versatile and distributed further via large databases and library subscriptions
 - Pre-prints are distributed openly, but might not have the advantage of the final publisher version (e.g. you have to save it in a suitable format and register the metadata yourself). Also depending on the platform you choose for publishing.
 - Post-prints might be subject to embargo for 2–24 months and is also only the manuscript version of your paper that can be used.
- What is the total cost in Sweden for publishing and reading?
 - Numbers should be available in the national library statistics database: http://bibstat.kb.se/
 - You can also check publishing fees from an international perspective in the Open APC database: https://www.intact-project.org/openapc/
