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






Pillars

WIKIPEDIA IS AN ENCYCLOPEDIA

- ❑ No original research
- ❑ Style form for the text
- ❑ Everything does not fit in an encyclopedia, there is a notability criteria

EDITORS SHOULD TREAT EACH OTHER WITH RESPECT AND CIVILITY

- ❑ Respect your fellow wikipedians, even when you don't agree
- ❑ Never use Wikipedia as a battleground



FREE CONTENT THAT ANYONE CAN USE, EDIT AND DISTRIBUTE

- ❑ All users license their work under free license, so anyone can use it – even for commercial reasons
- ❑ Plagiarizing from other sources is forbidden and controlled

A NEUTRAL POINT OF VIEW

- ❑ Wikipedia characterize information and issues rather than debate them, presenting different opinions where such exist
- ❑ No commercials of any kind

WIKIPEDIA HAS NO FIRM RULES

- ❑ There are policies and guidelines, but they are always open for discussion
- ❑ The principles and spirit is what matters
- ❑ Be bold!

Other important aspects

COPYRIGHT AND PLAGIARISM

- You cannot copy content from copyrighted sources to Wikipedia
- Only brief quotations are allowed
- Use your own words!

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- No paid articles
- No commercials of any kind
- Don't write about yourself





Examples of methods

- Translation of relevant articles to your own language
- Evaluating existing articles within your field of education, investigating what the students know, or don't know
- Teaching students how to improve articles (eg. in adding citations or text), contributing to more accurate information
- See Wikipedia as a platform for (popular) science communication in encyclopedic form, adapting language etc.
- Teaching students how Wikipedia works, raising awareness of source criticism, copyright, independence etc.
